II. Committee Reports:

A. Vice-President, Tamara Warhol

- (1) The winner of the SECOL Student Excellence Award 2023 is Leah Nodar, a PhD Candidate, Linguistics Department, Purdue University. Leah's interests include sociolinguistics, language and law, language ideology, linguistic discrimination, and public engagement. Last year, Leah presented a paper titled "Pronominal Apposition, It Could Be Useful: Bringing Back an Abandoned Variable in Sociolinguistics" at the SECOL 90 meeting at the University of Mississippi, Oxford, Mississippi. This paper was unanimously selected as a winner amongst submitted nominations. As the winner of SECOL Student Excellence Award, Leah will receive a check in the amount of \$200, a publication in a future issue of the *Southern Journal of Linguistics*, and a free membership for the next year, 2025.
- (2) Student paper nominations are solicited for the SECOL Student Excellence Award 2024 (a \$200 check, free one-year membership, and a publication at the *SJL*). Suggest for this award a student paper that you were impressed with at SECOL 2024, or self-nominate. B. Treasurer, Paul Reed

- (1) Finances are in good shape: \$12,050.63 in our bank account, and \$2,001.55 in our PayPal account, for a total of \$14,052.18.

C. Secretary, Irina Shport

- (2) Three motions to approve constitutional amendments that govern the redistribution of some responsibilities among SECOL Officers were unanimously approved at the SECOL 2023 General Business Meeting by those present. The amendments were enacted immediately upon their approval by the membership at the General Business Meeting 2023. No objections have been received afterwards, and the discussion of these amendments is now closed.

D. Southern Journal of Linguistics' Editor, Justin White

- (1) The journal has been published up through the Spring 2022 issue. We will begin back printing later issues (Fall 2020, Spring 2021, Fall 2021, Spring 2022, Fall 2022, Spring 2023) and sending them out to the libraries that subscribe to the Journal.
- (2) The call for the special issue in honor of Michael Montgomery curated by Reed is about to go out. Watch this space!

III. Elections: Jon Forrest presented a candidate proposed by the Nomination Committee (Paulina Bonds, Jon Forrest, Joy Peltier) for voting and confirmation.

According to the SECOL Constitution, the Executive Committee appoints the Secretary and the Treasurer; all other members of the slate are approved by the membership at the General Business Meeting.

(1) To replace Rachael Allbritten as an Executive Committee Member-at-Large, Marta Galindo (Georgia State University) has been nominated and agreed to serve for the 2024-2027 term.

Other officers and committee members will continue in their current roles. Shport has updated the slate at <u>https://secol.org/officers-committees/</u>. The slate will be declared elected if there are no additional nominations or objections submitted to the Secretary by July 1, 2024.
